The City of Fairburn has kicked off its groundbreaking "Love Thy Neighbor" program, aimed at assisting Prime residents-those aged 55 and older or disabled—in addressing exterior code violations they cannot manage on their own. This community-focused initiative unites local businesses, volunteers, and organizations to provide free assistance to residents, tackling issues like yard maintenance, junk removal, and minor repairs.

The latest project, completed on September 13th, transformed the backyard of a deserving resident from "drab to fab," as neighbors and volunteers came together for a day of service. The event not only improved the resident's property but also strengthened community ties.
