City of Fairburn Launches 'Love Thy Neighbor' Initiative to Support Vulnerable Residents

The City of Fairburn has kicked off its groundbreaking "Love Thy Neighbor" program, aimed at assisting Prime residents—those aged 55 and older or disabled—in addressing exterior code violations they cannot manage on their own. This community-focused initiative unites local businesses, volunteers, and organizations to provide free assistance to residents, tackling issues like yard maintenance, junk removal, and minor repairs.

The latest project, completed on September 13th, transformed the backyard of a deserving resident from "drab to fab," as neighbors and volunteers came together for a day of service. The event not only improved the resident's property but also strengthened community ties.

Londell Fleming, the City's Code Enforcement Manager, emphasized the broader impact of the program: "Love Thy Neighbor is about more than just code enforcement—it's about restoring dignity and pride to our community's most vulnerable. It showcases the power of working together."

Mayor Mario B. Avery echoed this sentiment, encouraging widespread participation: "This program is a shining example of what makes Fairburn special. It's about creating a community where every resident feels valued and supported."

City Administrator Tony M. Phillips highlighted the long-term vision: "We are not just addressing immediate needs but building a sustainable model of care and responsibility."
