Reporting Power outages in residential and commercial areas in 5-easy steps

Unfortunately, we have all experienced power outages in our homes, neighborhoods, and businesses. Mechanical or natural causes can cause these outages. Trees and limbs fall, and wildlife meets power lines or chews on them. Transformers malfunction from lightning strikes and damage from car accidents hitting poles.

Check your electric panel for any tripped breakers first then place in the reset position. If the toggle can be wiggled side to side, they need to be moved to the off position and quickly moved to the on position. The on off position is clearly marked on the face of each breaker.

Newer homes may have an exterior main breaker. It will be located where the electric meter is on the outside of your home or business. You may need to check to see if it is in the tripped position. If it is, pull down on the toggle firmly then push up firmly.

If you have not regained power after these steps, please call our customer service line at 770-964-2244 directly at our new utility location at Fairburn City Hall from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday through Friday.

If you need after-hours assistance, please call our I.U.C. (Interactive Utility Communications) dispatch line at 770-969-3481.

After you have contacted our representatives, they will immediately dispatch our Fairburn Power Department team to your location or area to investigate the cause of the interruption.
