There is no better time to beautify your property by addressing potential code violations. Here are some helpful tips and reminders from the Fairburn Code Enforcement Division:

HIGH WEEDS AND GRASS

Tall weeds and grass must be kept under 6 inches



PERMITS

Roof, Fences, Tree removal, etc: It is always best to check whether you need a permit.



TRASH BINS

Removal of the cart should be accomplished within a reasonable time following collection on the day the contents are emptied and collected.
